

The truths of Buddhist monks in Thailand

(20 October 2025)

(I wrote these truths and posted them on My Website on 20 October 2025. Please read them all.)

The Father Almighty or Allah told Me some main reasons why Buddhist monks in Thailand both Thai Buddhist monks and foreign Buddhist monks decided to ordain to be Buddhist monks in Thailand;

“Angie. The monks think “I do not work but disciples respectably donate good foods, good beverages, good things which necessary for my life, and money to me. Just keep my gesture to be reliable and teach the teachings which the disciples accept. If I become famous, it means much donations and Thai honorific ranks from the Thai king. And if I get a Thai honorific rank from the Thai king, it means honour, respect, salary, car, and comfortable life!””

An example of the Thai Buddhist monks who work the plan is “Pramaha Vuttichai Wachiramatee”

He was born on 29 January 1973. His father is “Saeng Boontheug” And his mother is “Thip Boontheug”

He ordained on 10 May 1994. He started getting Thai honorific ranks from the Thai king on 28 July 2019 (28 July is the birthday of pimp mha Vajiralongkorn).

Whereas, in an interview article, he told everyone “I decided to ordain to be a Buddhist monk in Thailand because I will have much spare time to read books. After I had ordained and I had had saving money from donations, the first thing I bought for myself was “a book shelf”!”

I had a chance to read his teaching books. So, I knew that he teaches Buddhists to adjust an envy to be a power, not teaches the Buddhists to purify their minds as 3 hearts of Buddhism as Buddha teaches Buddhists.

The Father told Me “Angie. Pramaha Vuttichai works the plan. One of his thoughts is “Why is not “Pra-Sri-Arn” a man?”. He also ordered the UN to award him as the first person who got the award!”

3 examples of the foreign Buddhist monks who work the plan are;

1) Ajahn Sumedho (Born Robert Karr Jackman at Seattle, Washington, U.S. on 27 July 1934)

He is an American Buddhist monk. He was a student of the late Ajahn Chah. He ordained in 1967. He started getting Thai honorific ranks from the Thai kings on 5 December 1992 (5 December is the birthday of pimp king Bhumibol), next on 12 August 2004, then on 28 July 2019 (28 July is the birthday of pimp mha Vajiralongkorn), and then on 15 November 2020.

2) Ajahn Amaro (Born Jeremy Charles Julian Horner at Kent, England on 2 September 1956)

He is a British-American Buddhist monk. He was a student of the late Ajahn Chah. He ordained in 1979. He started getting Thai honorific ranks from the Thai kings on 5 December 2015 (5 December is the birthday of pimp king Bhumibol. And he had started getting the Thai honorific ranks before king Bhumibol pretended to die around 1 year.), next on 28 July 2019 (28 July is the birthday of pimp mha Vajiralongkorn).

The Father told Me “Angie. He works the plan. He is assigned to fool Queen Elizabeth and The British Monarchy “I never know any information about the prophecy of Buddha about the end of the world which Angie has told everyone!””

3) Ajahn Jayasaro (Born Shan Michael Chiverton at Isle of Wight, U.K. on 7 January 1958)

He is a British-Thai Buddhist monk. He was a student of the late Ajahn Chah. He ordained on 3 June 1980. He started getting Thai honorific ranks from the Thai kings on 28 July 2019 (28 July is the birthday of pimp mha Vajiralongkorn), then on 27 July 2020, and then on 7 July 2021.

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The Father told Me “Angie. Foreign men who decided to ordain as Buddhist monks in Thailand chose to ordain as Buddhist monks in Thailand because they knew how the Buddhist monk circle in Thailand is and they knew how wicked all Thai people are, so they thought “I can harmonise with all the Thai people and Thailand!”

The Father told Me “Angie. Buddhist monks in Thailand including who got Thai honorific ranks from the Thai kings, do not believe in “Law of Karma” which Buddha teaches Buddhists. Even Buddhist monks in Thailand do not believe in “Law of Karma”, how about the Thai kings, the Thai dynasty, and all the Thai people?”

The Father also told Me “Angie. The pronunciation “Chah” in some English songs is meant not only one of Your friends but also Buddhist monks in Thailand who were students of the late Ajahn Chah!”

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
